## Canadian Unionized Employees say, “Enough is Enough!”

- **Saskatchewan Teachers** – Teachers in Saskatchewan turned down a government offer of 6 percent over 3 years, and voted **95%** in favour of a withdrawal of services. They are demanding a 16% salary increase over 3 years.
- **CUPE Community Social Service** – Workers across British Columbia voted **82%** in favour of job action.
- **Canadian Union of Postal Workers** – Voted **94.5%** in favour of job action to stop strips to existing sick leave and salary benefits.
- **Air Canada** – CAW local 2002 voted **98.25%** in favour of job action to stop proposed strips to pension packages
- **Sask. Government and General Employees Union** – Voted **86%** in favour of job action, rejecting a government offer of 5.5% salary increase over 3 years
- **Nova Scotia Government and General Employees Union** – Voted **85%** in favour of strike action to support
- **Hamilton City Workers** – Voted **84%** in favour of job action

- A strong strike vote is a show of solidarity and strengthens the bargaining committee’s position at the bargaining table for a fair settlement
- In order to undertake *any* collective action, a provincial vote must be taken– any action will be approved by another vote
